The Church

I Purpose:

Not to describe positions which hold here and now, but to reflect on an ecclesiology which would help shape the future Church, built upon the primary biblical concept of koinonia (organic unity).

This method enables us better to shed past accretions and to enrich authentic traditions, in order better to carry out the Church's mission to the world.

 - authority as a ministry of reconciliation
 - Universal Church Synodal principle

 - authority of charisms (the prophetic element), and of sound learning
