Anglicans and Roman Catholics agree that the faithfulness of God protects the Church from irrevocable commitment to error in essential In order to proclaim the Gospel and define its teaching m the matters of faith. the Church developed authoritative organs. Two agree in identifying these suchas organs as the episcopal college, ecumenical councils and primatial sees. In the past, misunderstandings arose from the impression that preservation from fundamental error belongs exclusively to a particular organ rather than to the whole Church. Other misunderstandings have derived from the false assumption that such organs must have the effect of stifling the freedom of the Spirit to inspire other agencies and individuals. It is clear, however, that the effective fulfilment of their responsibilities by these organs is impaired by divisions among Christians. Moreover the Church can fully discharge its teaching office only when a genuine balance is Allton, the authority of the definition does not come from it receptor by the people of job, struck between conciliar and primatial authority. The assent of the faithful is the final sign that the Church's authoritative decisions in matters of faith have been truly preserved from error by the Holy Spirit.
