Para. 30 line 25 (after Matt. 6.14f): Insert - (Thereby the Church's teaching is neither a private other-worldly mysticism irrelevant to contemporary society, nor a this-worldly political programme which is not itself subject to critical judgment in the light of the Gospel.)
