Attached are two brief ones done by Sandra Boyd from the joint library of the Weston (S.J.) School of Theology and the Episcopal Divinity School, as well as sample cover pages from the official publications of the women's ordination movements in the Episcopal and Roman Catholic Churches in the U.S.A. (RUACH and NEW WOMEN NEW CHURCH), which often carry bibliographical notes on this subject. In addition, and too late to my attention for xeroxing with this distribution, is the 26-page annotated bibliography appearing in ANGLICAN THEOLOGICAL REVIEW, Supplementary Series no. 6, June 1976, compiled by Dr. Ruth Tiffany Barnhouse, Fr. Michael Fahey S.J., Bridget Oram, and Fr. Bailey Walker, O.P.

This comes to a total of some 913 separate bibliographical entries. Of course some of these are duplicates, but others contain many separate items within each entry.
