2. Jurisdiction is given for the effective fulfillment of an office which determines its exercise and limits. Jurisdiction associated with different levels of episcope (i.e. of primates, metropolitans and bishops) is not always similar in kind. Jurisdiction is necessary for the fulfilment of an office and varies according to the specific functions of the ferm of episcope. The use of juridical terms does not mean that exactly the same authority is attributed to all those exercising episcope at different levels. The jurisdiction of a metropolitan in his province is not the exercise in a broader context of the jurisdiction exercised by a bishop in his diocese: the difference in jurisdiction is a difference in kind.
