AGREED STATEMENT ON THE EUCHARIST

- 1. Christ himself meets us in the Eucharist. It is the Holy Spirit who makes Christ really present for us in the Eucharist according to the words of institution.
- 2. The proclamation of the Word is a necessary part of the Eucharist, which, as a sacrament of faith, is born of the Word and nourished by it.
- The Eucharist can be called a sacrifice, firstly because it presents in a realistically symbolic way the once for all sacrifice of Christ on the Cross; and secondly because we participate in his sacrifice, offering our whole lives in obedience to Christ.
- 4. The Eucharist is more than merely human remembering. It is a memorial in which God's saving event in Christ is presented to us and a communion in which his people, growing together in Christ, realize their reconciliation in him.
- 5. The Eucharist also points forward to the fullness of God's promised redemption. It is a foretaste and a beginning of the perfect communion with God and of the restoration of all things in Christ.
